- Indigenous leadership, workforce development and succession planning.

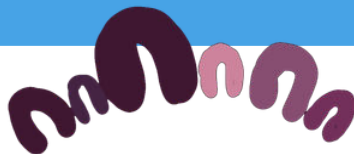
